EPA's Role at the Hunters Point Naval Shipyard Superfund site



- Provide Navy oversight to ensure Superfund laws and regulations, as well as EPA policies are met
- Review and provide comments certain work plans and reports
- EPA's mission is to protect human health and the environment

HPNS 2020 Radiological Retesting Activities: EPA Oversight Role

- Overseeing an approach that confirms the remedies are protective of human health and the environment
 - Comments on the Navy's report on the soil background study
 - Approval of Navy's plans to perform soil radiological retesting at Parcel G, which include dust management and air monitoring
 - Comments on the Navy's radiological cleanup levels for existing onsite buildings

HPNS 2020 Radiological Retesting Activities: EPA Oversight Role

- Oversight on the ongoing fieldwork
 - EPA has technical experts onsite
 - EPA will independently-analyze select soil samples, working with the state
 - EPA is paying close attention to the Navy's implementation of its dust management and air monitoring plan
 - ✓ Reviewing perimeter air monitoring data
 - ✓ Weekly check-ins with project managers
