5 **I. Call to Order**

6 Dr. Hunnicutt called the Environmental & Reuse Subcommittee meeting to order at 5:00pm.

8 **A. Roll Call**

9 Present: Dr. Veronica Hunnicutt, Servio Gomez, and Dedria Smith

11 A quorum was established at roll call.

13 **B. Approval of Agenda: June 22, 2020**

14 Dedria Smith made a motion to approve the June 22, 2020 agenda. Servio Gomez second
15 and the motion was passed.

17 **C. The Approval of the Meeting Minutes: January 27, 2020**

18 Dedria Smith made a motion to approve the January 27, 2020 meeting minutes. Servio
19 Gomez second and the motion was passed.

21 **D. Announcements**

22 Following the guidelines set forth by local and state officials during this health emergency,
23 the members of this CAC are meeting remotely to ensure the safety of everyone including

4 **III. Continuing Business:**

5 **A. Environmental Program Manager for Hunters Point Naval Shipyard (HPNS), Derek**
6 **Robinson, will provide a base wide update on the Navy's cleanup at HPNS. Information on**
7 **active fieldwork at Parcels E and F will be highlighted, as well as a summary of the**
8 **radiological background sampling report finalized in June 2020. In addition, Dr. Kathryn**
9 **Higley, Radiological Technical Advisor for the Hunters Point community will provide**
10 **answers to several frequently asked questions about radiological health and safety at HPNS**

11 **Derek Robinson (BRAC Navy)**

12 Derek Robinson gave a presentation that covered, HPNS Cleanup Overview: Parcel
13 Historical Use HPNS Parcel Map Parcel B: ship repair & maintenance Parcel C: ship repair
14 & radiological research Parcel D: ship repair & maintenance; radiological research Parcel E:
15 industrial operations & radiological research Parcel E-2: former HPNS landfill Parcel F:
16 offshore area in San Francisco Bay Parcel G: ship repair & maintenance Parcel A:
17 residential & administrative; transferred to SFRA in 2004 UC-1, UC-2, UC-3: former utility
18 corridors. Parcel Status Snapshot Parcel A: cleanup complete, transferred in 2004. Parcels
19 B-1, B-2: Groundwater monitoring ongoing, and soil vapor extraction (SVE) is ongoing at
20 IR-10. Parcel C: Groundwater monitoring, injections & SVE ongoing, and ongoing
21 radiological remediation at Building 253/211. Parcel D-1: Groundwater monitoring
22 ongoing. Parcel E: Remedial action ongoing. Parcel E-2 (landfill): Remedial action ongoing.
23 Radiological retesting is pending for Parcels: B-1, B-2, C, D-1, E, F,G, D-2, UC-1, UC-2,
24 and UC-3. Survey results and future recommendations includes: Investigations and data,
25 radiological scoping surveys identified discrete locations that require further investigation.
26 A large majority, approaching 95% of the finger pier and sub pen area, has been cleared
27 through these initial investigations. To ensure certainty, the Navy will perform further
28 investigation focusing on these discrete locations and concrete surfaces. The Navy discussed
29 the use of background data in retesting timeline Parcel G work is scheduled for July 2020,
30 6,900 samples will be taken, approximately 6 months of fieldwork. Parcels UC-1, UC-2,
31 UC-3, D-2 will follow Parcel G, Parcels C, D-1, E, following utility corridors and Parcel D-
32 2. Lastly, the Navy went over the cleanup work and COVID-19. A contractor conducts
33 temperature checks at entry to Parcel E work area per their H&S procedures for all actions.
34 Contractors evaluate activities to determine if they can be done safely and in accordance
35 with local shelter-in-place requirements. Typically, document production continues for
36 fieldwork activities that can be completed safely (as determined by the contractor). Health
37 and Safety (H&S) procedures are updated. Updated H&S procedures are reviewed by the
38 Navy. Bottom line: there have been some delays to fieldwork, but most fieldwork at HPNS
39 will continue once COVID-19 adjustments are in place.
