III. Continuing Business:

A. Update on Environmental Cleanup at Hunters Point Naval Shipyard (HPNS)

Michael Pound, Environmental Coordinator for the Navy’s Base Realignment and

Closure (BRAC) Program at HPNS, will provide an update on the Navy’s ongoing environmental cleanup at the former shipyard. Primary topics discussed will include:

- Upcoming mercury remediation at Parcel B Installation Restoration Site 26 (IR-26)**
- Parcel E Cleanup Progress. In addition, Mr. Pound will provide updates on the following ongoing activities:**
 - Parcel B IR-10/Former Building 123 Excavations**
 - Parcel UC-3 Radiological Retesting • Building demolition contract award**

At the May 2025 HPSCAC Environmental & Reuse Subcommittee Meeting, the Navy and project partners presented updates on environmental cleanup efforts at the Hunters Point Naval Shipyard (HPNS), beginning with the Parcel G Task Order awarded to ECC Infrastructure LLC on April 23, 2025, to demolish six radiologically impacted buildings, providing local hiring and small business subcontracting opportunities with major roles played by Silverado Contractors and Bayview Services. ECC plans career fairs, internships, and outreach to District 10 workers and businesses while tracking progress through monthly reviews. At Parcel B's IR-10 site, cleanup beneath the demolished Building 123 will begin on June 2, 2025, involving soil excavation, confirmation sampling, and a year of post-remediation monitoring. Radiological retesting continues at Parcel UC-3, with fieldwork involving excavation, dust suppression, and radiological scanning of soil and equipment.

Parcel E’s ongoing remediation includes processing 40,000 tons of previously excavated, radiologically screened shoreline soil, building rock barriers, and planning future contracts to complete shoreline stabilization and soil backfill. Over 103,000 tons of contaminated materials have already been removed from Parcel E.

At Parcel B-2’s IR-26 site, mercury groundwater treatment using Metafix injections has proven effective in 43 of 52 locations since 2016, and the Navy plans additional injections in 2026, followed by two years of monitoring to confirm results.

Fiscal Year 2025 project milestones include soil and groundwater remediation at multiple parcels, shoreline restoration, radiological retesting, and the award of over \$50.8 million in new contracts, all of which contribute to a larger \$250 million in active cleanup efforts at HPNS.

The Navy committed to continued community engagement, including a July 2025 update presentation, and provided contact details for public inquiries, regulatory agency representatives, and access to the online administrative record for transparency.
